Landowners from Cherokee and Anderson Counties are welcome to attend the 2018 annual Forestry and Wildlife Field Day at the I.D. Fairchild State Forest.

The field day will begin with a history of the I.D. Fairchild State Forest by District Forester, Jason Ellis. Then throughout the day, attendees will travel to four field sites (on hay covered 16' trailers) to learn about forestry and wildlife management. During lunch, Adrian Van Dellen, current chair of the Texas Black Bear Alliance, will give a presentation.

<u>Site #1</u> is about understory management techniques (herbicide, mulching, prescription burning) to provide habitat for wild turkey, red-cockaded woodpecker, white-tailed deer, and other types of wildlife. Speakers are Annie Farrell, district biologist with National Wild Turkey Federation, and Donna Work, biologist with Texas A&M Forest Service.

<u>Site #2</u> is about shortleaf pine restoration using natural and artificial regeneration techniques. Speakers are Dr. Eric Taylor, silviculturalist with Texas A&M Forest Service, and Jeff Brister, soil conservationist with Natural Resource Conservation Service.

<u>Site #3</u> is about wildlife habitat management practices that landowners can do on their own properties. Speakers are J.B. Wynn with Region 9 Quality Deer Management Association for LA, OK, and TX, and Reuben Gay, wildlife biologist with Texas Parks and Wildlife.

<u>Site #4</u> is about native understory plant identification and pollinators. Speaker is Kim Benton, horticulture county extension agent with Texas A&M Agrilife.
